




Greens Committee

Greens inspection for the season 2019/20 was different in respect of the Bowls Victoria Guidelines and New Inclusions to be taken in account for the Rating of the Greens.

To help Green Keepers, a copy of the Inspection Pad Report Form was provided to all parties prior to inspections taking place as well as a copy of the completed Form. This approach provided complete transparency enabling all interested parties to understand the reasons behind greens being rated as 'B' whereas they may have been rated as 'A' previously.

Being rated as 'B' did not mean that Clubs would not be considered to host Finals.

Ratings for Finals for the Pennant season does not rely on 'A' or 'B' ratings alone. Consideration is also given Club facilities, car parking and viewing space for spectators. These additional elements are considered at the time of Greens being inspected.

As in past years, the standard of greens across the Region was as expected. As always, Clubs use their best endeavours to present good playing conditions.

During the season, Greens Inspectors Courses were being coordinated by Bowls Victoria Greens Committee. These courses were conducted State-wide at various locations. As part of this process, Eastern Ranges Region was able to qualify an additional three (3) Greens Inspectors. These additional resources make it far easier for the team to cover all Clubs across the Region.

Unfortunately, the Finals season was cut short due to COVID-19 restrictions, resulting in the closure of all Clubs. In the interim members are asked to stay safe and observe the social distancing guidelines while we await the lifting of these restrictions and the re-opening of Club facilities.

With the closure of the State's sporting facilities, some Clubs took the opportunity of renewing greens however the team was not able to complete inspections. Inspections will recommence as soon as possible once the restrictions are lifted, and permission is given to Clubs to recommence operations.

Clubs are reminded that where greens are being renovated or renewed, that both the Eastern Ranges Greens Committee and Bowls Victoria are advised prior to work commencing and on completion so the inspections can occur in accordance with Bowls Victoria's requirements.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all of the Clubs' Greens Directors and Green Keepers for their collaboration and efforts to ensure everyone can play at the same standards that we have come to expect.

The Committee looks forward to seeing everyone at the commencement of the 2020-21 season.

Junior Development

The year just completed has been one of strong growth in the school sector with a large increase in participation by both Primary & Secondary Schools.

The Eastern Independent Schools Melbourne (EISM) programme was once again very successful and played over 2 venues Croydon & Ringwood, some 78 Students of year 9 participated in this event.

During the running of School Sports Victoria, Eastern Metropolitan Region for both Primary and Secondary Schools was held at Ringwood Bowls Club in March 2019.

Whilst talking with the sports teacher from Brentwood Secondary College, he explained to me that he had a problem; he released an expression of interest for Bowls to the students of Brentwood Secondary College, and the response was overwhelming with some 63 expressions of interest in Bowls, he could only enter a team of 12 students in the SSV Eastern Metropolitan Region which he found very difficult as the school had not participated in Bowls before.

We were able to find out who was the School Sports Victoria representative for Monash Division which turned out to be a sports teacher from Brentwood Secondary College. Contact was made to explain the sport of Bowls and promoted Bowls for 2020. The teacher was very keen and expressed gratitude that someone from Bowls Victoria contacted her. At the end of the meeting we were asked to attend Monash Division meeting of all sports teachers from the 5 schools which was held in the first week of term 3.

We explained to all present about our schools' program and promoted Bowls for 2020 which everyone was keen to become involved. Some 6 weeks later we received an email from the Head of Sports for Monash Division to see if we could organise a Bowls Gala Day to be held on 1st November 2019, the observatory quest asked was how many students may participate in this day, so some 2 weeks later we had a figure of about 190 Students covering all 5 schools, you could imagine the shock we got with this big number, as we would need to find a venue to cater for this number.

We approached Glen Waverley Bowls Club with this proposal which they become very excited about and were willing to help on the day, also we needed to source enough bowls for the day. Bowls Victoria supplied 25 sets, Monbulk 10 sets, Upwey Tecoma 10 sets, Eastern Eagles 6 sets and Glen Waverley 12 sets. Then we set about designing a format for specifically schools, which was completed and trialled before this event.

On the day we had planned to run a training session for 1 hour the play 1 game of 6 ends, Lunch break and another game of 6 ends during the lunch break we heard whispers that they would like to play 3 games. So the question was asked if they would like to play 3 games well they almost lifted to roof off Glen Waverley Club house with excitement, so we played another 2 games after Lunch break, all in all it was a great day so much so that they booked another Gala day for 31st October 2020 at Glen Waverley Bowls.

Monash Division Secondary Schools Gala was held at Glen Waverley Bowls Club on 1st November 2019 with some 120 students participating. Schools were, Brentwood Secondary College, Wheelers Hill Secondary College, Wellington Secondary College, South Oakleigh Secondary College. John Monash Science School did not participate due to Exams.

Just before the end of the school year they requested another small Gala Day in February 2020 which we were able to do, this was attended by some 42 students and another great day was had by all.

During term 3 and 4 we were able to engage Norwood Secondary College in Bowls which was held at Ringwood Bowls Club, so the students and teachers could walk down to the Club, it did not take long for the teachers to realise that the time allowed was not long enough, so they decided to allow more time in 2020.

Luther College also had some students participate in Bowls apart from those who played in the EISM competition which was successful once again. Donvale Christian College also participated in some Bowls program and will be back in 2020.

Aquinas College were once again very active in Bowls as part of the School curriculum PE program where each year 9 class had 3 weeks of Bowls which was held over the 4 terms so some 120 students participated.

Our Eastern Eagles continue to grow in numbers and have had some success with 3 students (Blake Keel, Mitchell Keel, and Carli Morrison) from Berwick Bowls Club won the inaugural Junior League challenge held in term 3 of 2019 and the big white flag hangs in the Berwick Bowls Club, Club House for all to see.

15 of The Eastern Eagles once again travelled to Daylesford in January for the Flapper Shield tournament. We did not win but thoroughly wet on the way home as we faced a big storm as we were leaving Daylesford.

Laws and Umpiring

It is with pleasure that I present the Annual Report on behalf of the Laws and Umpiring Committee.

The Committee again experienced a very busy year during which the following events were undertaken:

1. Training courses for new Technical Officials were conducted from early November to December. The courses were held at the following venues, Blackburn and Yarra Glen bowling clubs. A total of 28 Technical Officials qualified 20 Umpires, 4 of whom upgraded from Measurers, and 8.
2. The courses for reaccrediting Technical Officials were planned to be done in March. Unfortunately, all courses are now in a state of isolation. All Officials who are due for reaccreditation have had their registrations held current for a further 12 months. It is hoped that these courses can be conducted later this year.
3. With BV unable to provide me with a current list of officials who are due to reaccredit I would ask all officials to check their own due date and lodge the appropriate paperwork with BV. The form is on the BV website.
4. Under the current accreditation/ reaccreditation system applications for both processes continue to arrive. Currently we have several members to complete their courses.

5. It is proposed that courses for both new and reaccrediting officials will be conducted early next season. Notice of these activities will be issued by the Umpire's Committee and advertised on the BV website later in the year.
6. There are extensive training resources on the BV website and information on how to go about registering as a new official or doing the reaccreditation course.

The Committee

1. The other members of the committee, Gordon Baker, Ken Chapman, Sheila Dillon and Adrian Goldsmith, who worked so hard during the year. I thank them for their assistance.
2. Ron Hutton resigned from the committee during the season and must be thanked for his work on the he has done over the last 25 years.
3. Thank you to Blackburn and Yarra Glen also for the use of their facilities during the year.

Night Pennant

The 2019-20 Night Pennant competition comprised 18 sides from 13 Clubs,

The competition started in November 2019 and the playing format was the same as that of prior years with the competition. A draw comprising a section of 10 teams and a second section of 8 teams.

At the completion of the 14 Sectional rounds Blackburn 1 finished on top of Section 1 with 195 points, followed by Heathmont 1 with 172 points. In section 2, Mitcham 2 finished on top with 174 points, followed by Burwood District on 160 points.

The semi-finals were played across two clubs on the 17 March, 2020, on a cool evening for the bowlers. Blackburn 1 overcame Burwood District by 20 shots (91-71) at Heathmont 1 and Mitcham 2 beat Heathmont 1 by 4 shots (80-76) at Blackburn.

The final was due to be played at Heatherdale Recreation & Bowls Club on 24 March 2020, between Blackburn 1 v. Mitcham 2.

Based upon advice from Bowls Australia and Bowls Victoria the final has been postponed indefinitely due to the Corona Virus-19.

Subject to the easing of COVID-19 restrictions the preferred option is to hold the final in late October 2020, after the pennant session has started and prior to the next Night pennant competition. This will be discussed with the competing clubs closer to the date.

The night pennant bank balance stands at \$2,034.80 as of the end of May 2020.

We still require additional people to join the committee, so if you can assist please contact myself or Arthur Coghlan.
