With the success of the Eastern Eagles, we have many talented juniors as we move forward. Currently, Olivia Slade and Will Mays (Heathmont) together with Mitch Keel (Berwick) have been invited to trial for state under 18 selections. Olivia represented Victoria in the test match against Tasmania.

Bowls Victoria combined both the Men's' and Women's' Region Sides event at Shepparton. It was pleasing to see the players become one team supporting each other with the banter crossing the rinks. The men's' team were able to win the trophy for the first time since unification. Rod Nicolson (Lilydale) played in that team as well as the current one, a great achievement. The women produced one of their best performances in this tournament. When the final was being played most of this team stayed to support the men onto their victory. We really were one team, and this was recognised by many of the officials and other regions. To achieve this a big thank you to the selectors and the managers. We need to recognise Troy Stafford, the men's' coach who led the team with inspirational speeches. One pleasing note was the fact that one of the under 18's Olivia Slade (Heathmont) was in the women's side.

Champion of Championship matches were held in Bendigo and all our players performed well and their achievements can be found later in this report. Richard, your work is appreciated, especially when you have to edit my reports!




# Audit Report



## **Junior Development**

Despite the late start to the season and COVID restrictions impacting regular attendance at squad clinics, the Eastern Eagles Junior Development Squad had its best on-green performance for many years.

With a renewed focus on high-performance training clinics, the Committee set the ambitious target of developing a State/National U18 champion within the next three to four years.

With the renewed focus and as a squad, Eastern Eagles achieved the following successes during season 2020-21:

- Olivia Slade (Heathmont), Runner Up ERBR Women's Open Singles Championship and ERBR Women's Region Side representative.
- Will Mays (Heathmont), Runner Up ERBR Men's Novice Championship and Winner ERBR Men's Triples Championship.
- Olivia Slade, top 10 placings at Vermont South's Super Singles tournaments, an event where 8 Eastern Eagles squad members played against open company.
- Eastern Eagles squad just missed qualifying for the final of the Junior Provincial Championship (Flapper Shield).
- Eastern Eagles squad, Winner Doug Kneebone tournament.
- Eastern Eagles squad members participated in Ringwood Classic with Flynn Eaton (Hastings) and Blake Keel (Berwick) in rink which finished 7th overall.
- Flynn Eaton and Blake Keel, Runner Up U18 Boy's Pairs State Championship.
- Mitchell Keel (Berwick) and Will Mays (Heathmont) played Division 1 for their respective clubs in the Weekend Metropolitan Pennant competition.

An Eastern Ranges Under 18 Championship was also held during the season. This event was won by Will Sciberras (Dandenong Club).

Bowls Victoria recently announced the U18 squad to trial for State selection with Olivia Slade (Heathmont), Mitchell Keel (Berwick), Will Mays (Heathmont) and Will Sciberras (Dandenong Club) invited. Both Olivia and Will Sciberras also played in the U18 Test series against Tasmania.

My thanks to the other committee members Liz Bower (Ringwood) and Laurie Browell who work tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure squad members enjoy the sport. And a big thank you also to the parents who support their children in pursuing their dreams.

## Night Pennant

For season 2021-21 entries were received for 16 sides from 11 Clubs, two less than last year. This is a good result considering the uncertainty around COVID. Lilydale and Ferntree Gully joined the competition, while Mulgrave CC, Ringwood, Mooroolbark and Bayswater/Heatherdale dropped out.

This season saw 265 players compete in the competition. At the completion of the 8 Sectional rounds Lilydale finished on top of Section 1 with 125 points, followed by Mitcham 1 with 100 points and Mitcham 3 on 91 points. In Section 2, Ferntree Gully and Heathmont 2 both finished with 98 points with Ferntree Gully having the better score difference and Mitcham 2 on 96 points.

The semi-finals were played at Burwood District Bowls club on the 16 March 2021. Lilydale defeated Heathmont 2 by 3 shots (71-68) and Mitcham 1 defeated Ferntree Gully by 44 shots (105-61).

The final was played at Heathmont Bowls Club on Tuesday 23 March 2021. Lilydale defeated Mitcham 1 by 4 shots (76-72). Well done to both teams for a great game.

The BowlsLink platform was used to run the night pennant competition. One major difference to how metro pennant results are submitted is that the competition only requires the Home Club to finalize the scores. No action is required from the away club. Bowls Victoria has indicated this is the way Metro pennant will go next season. Once side managers became familiar with Bowlslink, the process was worked well.

The major issues over the season were:

1. Some clubs didn't enter their teams and the results were finalized before this was completed.
2. At times the away team was not able to make any last-minute team changes before the results were finalized. This would be a significant issue for Weekend and Midweek pennant.

Feedback has been provided to Bowls Victoria about both items.

A survey was conducted with the competing clubs around the format of the Eastern Ranges Night Pennant competition. This included day of the week, side format and length of season.

The survey provided some good feedback on the best night to hold night pennant. It was split between Tuesday and Wednesday.

- The biggest issue for Tuesday is that some clubs are struggling to field a team due to more players playing during the day (meaning we could have less teams).
- The cons for Wednesday is that some clubs run revenue raising activities on Wednesday night eg. Jack attack, barefoot bowls and organized social competitions don't want to play night pennant on Wednesday night as it will have a financial impact on the club.

The majority of the clubs felt triples was the best format, though a few clubs were concerned that triples placed significant pressure on new bowlers to land the jack from the outset, but felt it was the best format to continue with at this stage.

Overall, the preferred length of the season was to move back to around 14 weeks starting after Cup Day.

The approach we are going to adopt for this year's Night Pennant season is to split sections across both Tuesday and Wednesday nights. The hope would be that more teams join the night pennant competition. A minimum of 6 teams would be required for any section.

The season will start after Cup Day and align to midweek pennant dates with a 10-game season plus finals. The exact number of teams and sections won't be confirmed until after entries are submitted, however clubs will need to nominate a night or let us decide for them.

The use of BowlsLink has allowed us to try the option of splitting it across both nights. We will conduct a survey to seek feedback at the end of the season and adjust/modify it for the following season.

Also, where Clubs have insufficient players to form a side, then please consider a composite team with another Club as they do work well.

With the changes to the competition, it would be useful if we could get 2 or 3 competing clubs to assist with being part of a committee to ensure we are making changes that benefit most clubs. Any assistance would be most welcome.
