The team represented six of the regions' clubs. Most of those selected played premier, division 1 or 2 in Metropolitan pennant. One other player was selected but was unavailable and that would have meant 7 clubs.

THE EVENT: The event was held from 8-10th April at the Echuca and Moama Bowling Clubs. Both provided sufficient rinks for the men's and women's teams to play side by side. Friday and Sunday at Echuca and Saturday at Moama. The facilities at both clubs were excellent and the greens were running well. Lunches were provided on all days and unfortunately it must be stated that the ones provided at Moama were substandard for such an event. Echuca provided excellent meals and catered for our one dietary request appropriately.

ACCOMODATION & MEALS: The Region provided accommodation at the Murray River Holiday Park in Moama. The team twin shared two-bedroom cabins at the facility. These were very clean; the water was hot and the space adequate for the weekend. Again, this year the Region provided dinner on both Friday and Saturday nights. Friday, we ate at the Border Inn in Moama which was convenient in respect to location; the food was fresh and well presented. The service was efficient and would certainly recommend the use of this venue again. Saturday a barbeque was provided at the park. We had use of the camp kitchen until 10pm. The food for this was all purchased in Moama, thereby supporting local businesses.

UNIFORM: All players wore the Region uniform and conformed to the rules as issued by BV at the managers meeting held on April 1 via Zoom.

Players were presented with region caps embroidered with '2022' to recognise their selection for this year's event.

All this year's women team have purchased their uniform.

TRAVEL: Players travelled to Moama either by themselves or with others- private cars.

SELECTION: The selectors for this year were Carol Protopapas (Heathmont), Patty Whorlow (Blackburn) and Pam Arnot (Croydon). They met on several occasions and discussed thoroughly the performance of players in both metropolitan pennant and region events. With the increased use of BowlsLink this process has been made easier.

PRACTICE: Two nights were held at the Mitcham Bowls Club, the first was a meet and greet the players with each rink being given the opportunity to participate in a match against other members. The second night was a practice match against the Mornington Peninsula region which gave all players a good hit out. This year the women's team finished third in their section and fifth overall. All players performed well in most matches with many rising to the occasion due to the calibre of the opposition. Patty Whorlow's rink finished third in the player rankings for section B, which was a fantastic effort by all.

COMMENTS: There are lots...just how well they all come together as a team and support ed each other must be the standout. This has continued over from last year and watching some other regions they have yet to get to this point, e.g., men and women's teams do not combine at the start of the match; they don't appear to sit together between matches or at lunch; and more importantly there is not the noise across the rinks between the two during a game. Rangers leave all the other regions in our section far behind in the camaraderie stakes!

MOVING FUTURE:

It is important that the region starts working with a group of women to establish a training group. The aim of this will be to improve the women's skills and knowledge. One area that is a concern is the role of skip. There is little depth within the region in this area. Clubs need to be involved to also give women training and opportunities in this position (if they are capable). It would be proposed to start this with sessions in November, December, and January prior to team selection. This is a task I am happy to be responsible for. Another area is to ensure that all clubs are monitored to find women for the region side. This process was carried out by the selectors through the checking of team results as well as participation in region events. It cannot be stressed enough that region participation is important.

It was a privilege to have the role as manager.

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT

A later start to the 2021-22 bowls season and the compacted scheduling of Region championships impacted the formal structure of junior training clinics during the year. Nonetheless, representatives of the Eastern Eagles Junior Development Squad were prominent in the various State junior events held throughout the year.

In recent months, squad numbers have been impacted as several members attained 18 years of age and are therefore ineligible for Junior events.

Throughout the financial year, Eastern Eagles were represented in the following events:

• Doug Kneebone (January 2022)

Two teams entered this competition. From a total 18 entries, the teams finished a credible 5th and 9th. In addition, one squad member represented a composite team which finished 4th overall.

Junior Provincial Championship (January 2022)

Following some late withdrawals due to COVID, the Eastern Eagles squad was bolstered with substitutes from Northern Flyers Junior Development Squad. Notwithstanding this minor setback, Eastern Eagles were the eventual winners of this event – ironically beating Northern Flyers. This was the first occasion that Eastern Eagles had won the event

Amity Bickley was Runner Up in the Girl's Singles Championship, while Will Mays partnered with Koby Cromie (Deer Park) to win the Boy's Pairs Championship.

Other junior events held during the financial year include School Sports Victoria gala days. The Committee would like to extend its thanks to Glen Waverley and Bennettswood Bowling Clubs for their assistance in hosting these events.

While fewer formal bowling clinics were conducted during the financial year, the Committee would like to acknowledge the efforts of Clubs (in particular Berwick and Heathmont) to include juniors in their Pennant competitions. Mitch Keel (Berwick) and Will Mays (Heathmont) are members of their respective Club's #1 Side (Division 1). Undoubtedly, this involvement has benefited both players.

Any Club wanting to increase its numbers with juniors should approach a member of the Committee who would be happy to assist with additional coaching opportunities
