Welcome to another edition of the Eastern Ranges bowls Region Newsletter.

Eastern Ranges representatives – Kirsten Day (Yarra Glen), Olivia Slade (Lilydale) and Jessica Wallace (Lilydale) – were selected to represent BV's Women's City squad to play against Country at Bendigo. That event was conducted over the weekend of 6 -7 April with City defeating Country. This event is one of the main pathways for individuals seeking State selection. Congratulations girls.

The final ERBR Championship events for season 2023-24 have also concluded. Congratulations to the Championship Committee on another successful season.

The Champion of Champions event was conducted at Boronia. In the Men's event, Ben Simmons (Yarra Glen) defeated John Rich (Berwick) in a see-sawing match. Meanwhile in the Women's event, Jessica Wallace (Lilydale) defeated Mandy Carter (Mooroolbark) to clinch her third Region CoC title.

The Over 60s Singles Championship was played at Vermont South. Graeme Spencer (Mulgrave CC) defeated Stephen Coles (Heathmont) in the Men's event, while Jennifer Bainbridge (Pakenham) just missed out on getting a three-peat in the Women's event losing to Jan Macgregor (Heathmont).

The 2024 edition of the Victorian Open was again played around Morwell/Traralgon. Several Eastern Ranges bowlers were successful in qualifying for the knockout rounds.

Olivia Slade (Lilydale) was part of the composite team that won the Women's Open Triples, while Neville Brown (Pakenham) was Runner Up in the Men's Singles.

But the main chatter around the greens was the success of Ron Dalton's (Mulgrave CC) team beating legend Matt Flapper (Ocean Grove) in the Men's Triples sectional rounds to qualify for the main draw. Word has it that Matt dropped a six after the jack rebounded into play, handing Ron the match.

It was also pleasing to see a few Eastern Ranges junior bowlers compete in the State U18 Championships which were recently conducted at Club Sunbury. Many future stars of the game are successful at these junior events.

The next major events to follow include the State Championships (13 - 24 April), State Para Championships (22- 25 April), the Novice Carnival (11 - 13 May) and the O60s Carnival (20 - 26 May).

I wish all bowlers every success at these events.

A Region Delegates meeting was held in March. The minutes of this meeting have been circulated, however anyone wanting to see a copy should contact Region Secretary, Jenny Holmes.

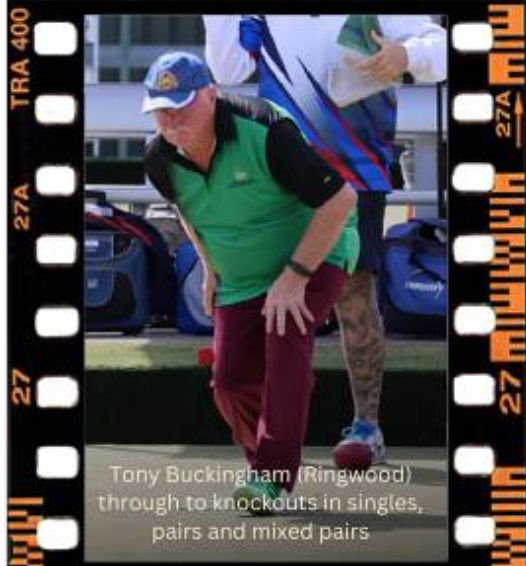

ERBR Night Pennant Report



The Night Pennant competition has come to a close for this year, and what an exciting journey it has been! Let's recap the thrilling finals over the last three weeks:

Tuesday Qualification Finals (20th February):

Across both Mitcham and Blackburn bowls clubs, the following matches took place:

- Mitcham 1 defeated Upwey-Tecoma with a 22 shot lead (89-67).
- Lilydale defeated Mitcham 2 with an 18 shot margin (85-67).
- Mitcham 3 defeated Ferntree Gully with a 29-shot margin (86-57).
- Blackburn 1 defeated Mooroolbark with a 36-shot margin (92-56).

Semi-Finals (27th February):

- The action shifted to Burwood District Bowls Club:
- Lilydale defeated Mitcham 1 by 7 shots (final score: 75-68).
- Mitcham 3 defeated Blackburn 1, securing a narrow victory by 3 shots (final score: 67-64).

Final (5th March 2024):

- The final took place at Mitcham Bowls Club:
- In a hard-fought battle, Lilydale emerged as the champions, defeating Mitcham 3 by 9 shots (final score: 78-69).

Congratulations to both teams for a great game.

This season's Night Pennant competition saw 211 players participating across 12 sides from 9 clubs. Although this number is slightly lower than previous seasons. The competition still plays a crucial role in introducing new enthusiasts to our sport and giving our experienced bowlers another chance for a competitive game.

Bowls Victoria successfully conducted a trial with the Metro West Region's Night Pennant during this season. The positive outcome of this trial has led to plans for further expansion. Starting in the 24/25 season, the Eastern Ranges Night Pennant will be included. This expansion aims to streamline administration and organization within the region, benefiting both players and organizers.

1. Administration and Support:

o Bowls Victoria will take over the administration of the competition. They will provide support across various aspects, including:

- Competition creation: Ensuring a well-organized and efficient setup.
- Managing entries: Streamlining the process for clubs and players.
- Developing Conditions of Play: Ensuring fair rules and guidelines.
- Effective promotion: Utilizing the Bowlslink portal for communication.

2. Fee Collection and Decision-Making:

o Regions will continue to handle fee collection for the event. This ensures consistency and familiarity for clubs.

o Regions will also retain responsibility for decisions related to:

- Evening of play: Determining which evening the matches will take place.
- Format: Deciding on the competition format.

3. Finals Series:

- o Bowls Victoria will organize a Finals Series involving the Region winners.
- o This series may span multiple grades and will take place at a central venue.
- o The specific format for the Finals Series will be determined by BV.



A survey will be conducted to seek feedback on the competition and any improvements that could be made. This will be to existing clubs asking for ideas on how the competition could be improved and the preferred format and start time. Other clubs will be surveyed to see the level of interest in joining the Bowls Victoria run competition and how it should be structured.

LAWS & UMPIRING (LU) COMMITTEE UPDATE

Since my August 2023 LUC Annual Report, the committee has continued to work to accredit new officials and reaccredit existing officials using the newly implemented Bowls Victoria process.

With a busy pennant and championship season ending soon, I wish to thank all ERBR club and region officials for their work in managing club, region, State and pennant competitions from an officiating perspective. Clubs that have hosted ERBR championship events and pennant finals are to be congratulated for the professionalism, diligence and commitment shown to delivering great outcomes in the spirit of healthy competition.

The focus in the pre-winter months ahead will be to set-up further reaccreditations for those recently lapsing or soon to lapse and arrange on-green testing for new officials who have completed online modules via BowlsLearn (instead of face-to-face training sessions with the region's Presenter/Assessors).

Unfortunately, a planned on-green accreditation session for approximately 11 new officials in February 2024 had to be cancelled due to the storms and the subsequent closure of Mulgrave Country Club for several days. This session is set to be rescheduled in the coming few weeks (subject to completing remaining ERBR championships, the staging of the Vic Open, Easter and other potential impediments) and all affected officials will be informed of the new date/s for the on-green activity.

ERBR LUC will continue to periodically offer face-to-face learning opportunities for those preferring this approach (one of the options presented when registering/applying to become an official). This includes training sessions and practice on-green sessions in the lead-up to the on-green testing components. The LUC is mindful of the convenience of online learning supplemented by on-green (face to face) testing as required for both officials and presenter/assessors alike. For aspiring new officials, there are extensive training resources on the BV website and information on how to register as a new or reaccrediting official.

Since August 2023, we have successfully:

1. Reaccredited 22 officials.
2. Accredited 24 new officials.

Reaccreditation continues to be via a two-part process:

1. After registration via BV, candidates are emailed an exam paper to complete as an open book exam. The candidate is asked to return their completed paper (preferably by email) for assessment.
2. After assessment of the exam paper, an on-green assessment is arranged to complete the process.

The committee continues to communicate with new applicants and those due for reaccreditation to promote planned sessions and book people in to a suitable session(s).

The members of the LU committee are Gordon Baker, Lyn Baker, Rodney Bates, Peter Bowman, Doug Whorlow and I thank them for their continued assistance.

Novice bowlers from across the state will gather in the Eastern Ranges playing area to compete in the new format Novice State Carnival from May 10th to May 13th, 2024.

The Mulgrave Country Club will be the Carnival's 'Hub Venue', hosting all the finals. Supporting host clubs include Glen Waverley, Burden Park, and Dandenong Club.

The 2024 event is open to any bowler who became affiliated with a bowling club (nation-wide) after May 1st, 2021 (inclusive). This new eligibility period is an extension on the previous 2-year window, and will enable more entrants to participate in what is expected to become a popular event on the bowls calendar.

The Carnival will now include both Men's and Women's Singles (21-up) and Pairs (15 ends, 3-bowl pairs) formats, rather than Singles only.

A new Facebook group hub will be launched in the new year to help facilitate entries for the carnival, so that novices can connect with other bowlers to form Pairs if they don't have someone to partner with.

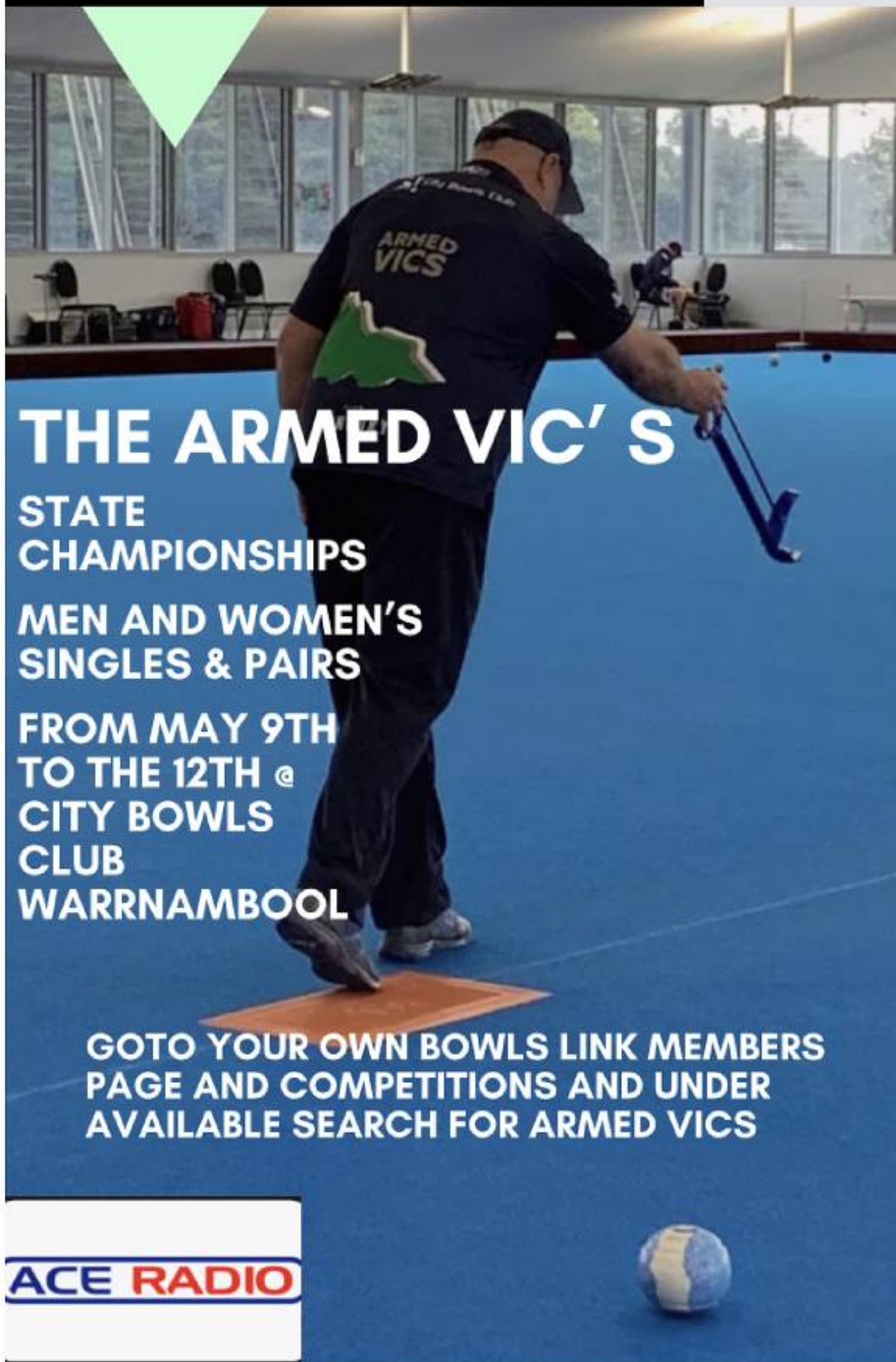

The Series format provides a higher standard for players vying for positions in the State Sides, increased visibility for players from across the State, and creates a more meaningful format for all players as they are tested in a truly competitive environment.

Featuring the best city and country players in the State going head to head for bragging rights, teams consist of 24 men per side (6 rinks) and 16 women per side (4 rinks), playing 5 x 15 end games across the two-day series. The team with the most game wins will take the title.

A historical record of all players chosen to represent both the City and the Country Teams is made, with players presented with a numbered cap in recognition of their selection.

The City vs Country Squads have been announced for the annual City vs Country Series, another important step in the State selection pathway. To be hosted for the first time by [Bendigo East Bowling Club](#), the Series will take place on the weekend of 6th – 7th April, 2024. This will be the fourth edition of the Series, with the ledger in favour of the Country Squad 2-1.
