Welcome to another edition of the Eastern Ranges bowls Region Newsletter.

April was the month for State Championships. The Open Championships were held at Bendigo East Bowling Club from 13 – 21 April, while the Para Championships were held at Kangaroo Flat Bowling Club from 22 – 25 April.

Several Eastern Ranges representatives performed well at these events. Detailed results from these Championships appear elsewhere in this Newsletter.

The next major event on the calendar is the Novice Carnival. This event is scheduled from 11 – 14 May. Due to the number of entries, qualifying rounds will be held at several Clubs throughout the eastern suburbs with Mulgrave Country Club nominated as the Hub Club. Other Clubs within Eastern Ranges Region selected to schedule qualifying rounds include Berwick and Glen Waverley. This is a wonderful opportunity for these Clubs to showcase their facilities.

It is pleasing to see so many Eastern Ranges players participating in this event. Over 350 entries were received for the singles competitions – 47 of these from clubs within Eastern Ranges. In all, 19 Eastern Ranges clubs will be represented at this event. And of the 47 singles representatives, 21 pairs teams have been formed.

The month of May will also see the inaugural Over 60s Carnival held at Club Barham from 20 – 26 May.

I wish all bowlers every success at these upcoming events.

The revival of the Eastern Eagles Junior Development squad is also underway. Junior clinics will be held on the 1st Saturday of each month. Our thanks to Mitcham who hosted the first clinic and to Heathmont for hosting future



events. Clubs wishing to host the junior clinics should contact any member of the Committee. The squad is open to any junior under 18 years of age, and participation is free.

An Eastern Ranges Delegates Meeting will be held on Monday 27 May. This meeting will be held electronically.

Clubs are reminded that Club Delegates should have decision making responsibility. Where Clubs do not have the confidence in their Delegates to make decisions on behalf of their respective Clubs, then please identify other suitable individuals to attend this meeting.

Several important decisions will be considered at this meeting including the Club Member Fee for season 2024-25, Region Sides framework, Region Championships schedule for season 2024-25, consideration of the Region Auditor and a proposed change to the Region's Constitution to recognize that the organisation falls under the umbrella of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

CHANGE TO CHILD-RELATED WORK

FROM BOWLS VIC

Bowls Victoria has recently implemented policy changes around child-related work and requiring a valid Working With Children Check (WWCC). One of the substantial changes is that Introductory Coaches are now required to have a current volunteer WWCC. Previously members could complete the Introductory Coach course online via BowlsLearn and start their coaching. Now, members need to complete the course online and provide a valid volunteer WWCC before any coaching can commence.

Below are the Bowls Victoria WWCC timelines for Introductory Coach:

- All new accreditations 1st January 2024
- Existing accreditations 30th June 2024
- All in their fourth year at renewal


