Entries in all region events continue to grow this season and the committee is grateful to the players, clubs and officials who support these events.

After a shaky start on the Friday, having lost to Mornington, the team started strong on Saturday morning with a win against Wimmera. After the lunch break the team blitzed Gippsland. The winning margin was sufficient to place the team on top of their Section and into the final against Geelong on the Sunday.

Sunday's final had its own drama with a 1 hour stoppage after 26 ends due to lightning and rain. At the resumption of play, the team maintained their focus and dominated Geelong to ultimately win the final.

Eastern Eagles Scare Some Good Bowlers





"This has been our biggest number of entries in the annual Shield competition with a total of 14 sides representing 10 regions throughout the State taking part," said Gerry Flapper.

"It is the nineteenth year the Shield has been played and the second year that Sebastopol Bowling Club has kindly offered to host the tournament."

On 15 January 2025, over 130 young bowlers, the future of our sport, converged on Sebastopol Bowling Club to participate in the 2025 Junior Provincial Shield (aka the Flapper Shield).

Eastern Ranges was represented by nine members of the junior development squad. The Eastern Eagles last won the Shield in 2022.

Notwithstanding that some players participate in the Metropolitan Weekend Pennant competition, some players were competing in their first formal junior event. And for some, it was the first time playing on grass.

The format involved 14 teams of nine players playing three games of 2-bowl triples – 12 ends or 75 minutes. Section winners then went on to play finals.

After a slow start, and under the guidance of Squad Coach, Matt Ottobre, the players regrouped in games 2 and 3 and almost caused some upsets.

The results of the matches played were:

•Game 1 vs Bendigo Dragons Lost 13 – 51

•Game 2 vs Geelong Giants Blue Drew 31 - 31

•Game 3 vs Northen Flyers Red Lost 30 – 31

The overall winners were Geelong Giants Gold who defeated Bendigo Dragons.

Congratulations to all players, and a big thank you to parents and officials who supported the team on the day.

Clinics will recommence on the 2nd Monday of each month at Heathmont (ie 10 February 2025). Sessions commence at 5.00 pm.

All juniors under the age of 18 are eligible to join the squad, and it is not necessary for juniors to be associated with any particular club.

As mentioned in my article in the December 2024 newsletter, with the pennant home and away season more than half completed, I'm delighted to be hearing many accounts of excellence in officiating across the region. I, and the other members of the LUC, regularly receive queries and questions about various laws and conditions of play for clarification and confirmation. We very much prefer to have officials ask these questions of the LUC to make sure and to then confidently inform club members of the proper/accurate response to the many and varied situations encountered during pennant play.

The **Conditions of Play** related to finals eligibility and movement of players from side to side during the final three rounds of pennant will feature over coming weeks. Officials at all clubs should familiarise themselves and be ready to answer questions from selectors to ensure no loss of points.

A reminder as we head towards finals, clubs hosting finals MUST appoint a **Controlling Body of the Day of Play** in addition to one or more umpires and/or meas-

urers (who can be appointed as umpire for the day if no other umpire is available) to enable decisions on game day. The Controlling Body cannot be the same person as the umpire(s) and Side Managers must also be different people to the Controlling Body and umpire (s) as this ensures the necessary decisions can be made by the appropriate person(s), free from conflict of interest.

Clubs that have so far hosted **ERBR championship rounds and finals** and provided officials and markers to cover the games played have done an excellent job. The standard of officiating and marking has been exceptional, and the LUC is reassured by the commitment of appointed officials to doing the job professionally.

The first round of **accreditation** of new officials and **reaccreditation** of existing officials will take place during late January and February, and I look forward to continuing to report on the growing numbers of high-quality officials in our region in 2025. Clubs are asked

to continue to encourage members to take up the challenge and become an umpire, measurer or marker to enhance their understanding and enjoyment of the game.


Message from our Club Support Manager
